



La Digue



La Digue has retained its privacy over the centuries owing to the reefs surrounding it. Known as the "Pearl" of the Indian Ocean, it is the fourth largest island in the Seychelles (five km by three) and lies 43km from Mahé and 6.5km from Praslin. Today visitors arrive in La Digue on a comfortable ferry or by

helicopter. La Digue's many attractions include boardsailing, sailing and fishing, windsurf, horse riding and cycling. The island houses a vanilla plantation, treatment plants, giant turtles, a coconut oil factory, well-preserved colonial style houses and rare birds.
