

# Shopping



A wide variety of locally-made craftwork is waiting for you to remember your dream holiday.

The majority of shops and stalls are located in Victoria, near the Clock, between Independence Avenue, Albert Street, Market Street and Fiennes Explanade, the favorite walkway with plenty of kiosks.

The centrally placed Camion Hall is in itself a statement of the Creole way of life and offers an array of exotic creations produced by local artisans.

Among the objects that best represent the local craftwork are those made with local materials such as the shells, which are used for creating jewels and household objects, coconut and banana fibre and raffia, with which very original bags and hats are made.



Then there are the objects in mother of pearl, such as hairslides, picture frames and Creole style bijoux and jewellery, also in silver and gold, beautifully and carefully made.

A visit to the Art Gallery and luxury shop of Kenwyn House, in the Francis Rachel Street, opposite the National Library Building, is absolutely worthwhile.
